Definition: Absolute Value

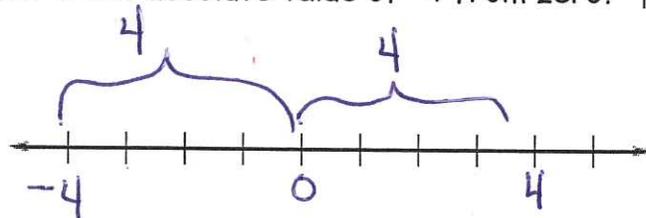
The distance from *zero* on a number line. The absolute value is always *Positive*

The symbol: *| |*

Before we begin:

1. How far is the absolute value of 4 from zero? $|4| = 4$

2. How far is the absolute value of -4 from zero? $|-4| = 4$



EXAMPLES:

Solve an absolute value equation. Solve $|x| = 7$

1.) The distance between x and 0 is 7.

1.) Solve $|x| = 7$

7, -7

2.) Solve $|x| = 15$

15, -15

- Notice that the expression inside the absolute value symbol equals 7 or -7 this suggest the following rules for solving absolute value equations....

Absolute value equation

Absolute Value Equations have the possibility of *2* solutions.

- This is because the value inside the $| \cdot |$ can equal either the $-$ or the $+$ value on the other side of the *equal sign.*

Always *isolate* the absolute value expression on one side of the equal sign before breaking the problem into 2 pieces

Solve $|x - 3| = 8$

Is the absolute value sign isolated? *yes*

1.) separate as equations

2.) solve each equation separately.

1.) $|x - 3| = 8$

$$\begin{array}{r} x - 3 = 8 \quad \text{or} \quad x - 3 = -8 \\ +3 \quad +3 \quad \quad \quad +3 \quad +3 \\ \hline x = 11 \quad \text{or} \quad x = -5 \end{array}$$

11, -5

Solve $3|2x - 7| - 5 = 4$

Is the absolute value sign isolated?

1.) rewrite the equation in the form $|ax + b| = c$

\div to both sides
Divide both sides by

2.) Next, solve the absolute value equation

2.) $3|2x - 7| - 5 = 4$

$$\begin{array}{r} \frac{3|2x - 7| - 5 = 4}{+5 \quad +5} \\ \hline 3|2x - 7| = 9 \\ \frac{3}{3} \quad \quad \quad \frac{9}{3} \\ \hline |2x - 7| = 3 \end{array}$$

$$|2x - 7| = 3$$

$$\begin{array}{r} 2x - 7 = 3 \quad \text{or} \quad 2x - 7 = -3 \\ +7 \quad +7 \quad \quad \quad +7 \quad +7 \\ \hline 2x = 10 \quad \quad \quad 2x = 4 \end{array}$$

$$\frac{2x}{2} = \frac{10}{2}$$

$$x = 5$$

$$\frac{2x}{2} = \frac{4}{2}$$

$$x = 2$$

Solve the equation if possible.

$$5.) |x| = 9$$

$$9, -9$$

$$\star 6.) |3x + 5| + 6 = -2$$
$$\underline{\quad -6 \quad -6}$$

$$|3x + 5| = -8$$

no solution

★ The Absolute value is never negative

$$\star 7.) 3|2x - 8| + 3 = 2$$

$$\underline{\quad -3 \quad -3}$$
$$\frac{3|2x - 8|}{3} = \frac{-1}{3}$$

$$|2x - 8| = -\frac{1}{3}$$

no solution
